Re: Petition letter for demanding my two kids from General Malual Majok

Dear President Kiir:

I am Paulino Mamiir Chol. I was born in Akuar section, Twic County, Warrap State. In 1987, the Murahalin militia kidnapped me, and one of Ngok's men in the city of Abyei helped me escape from the Arab family at night after three months of enslavement.

In the same year, due to constant attacks by Murahalin militias against our people, I joined the Sudan People's Liberation Movement/Army (SPLM/SPLA) in 1987. My maternal uncle Mator Malual Ayuel brought me to Ethiopia, and I was included in groups of small children. I spent over seventeen years in refugee camps in Ethiopia and Kenya as a Lost Boy.

I was a leader of the Lost Boys from 1988 until 2004. Between 1997 and 2004, I managed the resettlement of more than seven thousand Lost Boys from the Kakuma refugee camp to the United States, where more than four thousand Lost Boys went to America. However, three thousand remained in the Kakuma refugee camp because of the bribery of selling the names of the Lost Boys to other refugees. I went to America in 2004 and resided in Denver, Colorado, U.S.A.

My dear president, the primary purpose of writing this letter to you is twofold. First, I would like to express my sincere appreciation for your multiple accomplishments. Next, I request your excellency to order General Malual Awan (Majok) Chiengkuach, Chief Mabil Majok, General Majur Aler Deng, Aler Awan Chiengkuach, and Chiengkuach Awan Chiengkuach to bring my two kids, Nyadeng and Ayach Mamiir Chol.

My dear president, thank you so much for your humbleness, braveness, care, compassion, kindness, and loyalty to our country. Your first accomplishment under your caring leadership is peace among the people. I firmly believe that you are the only president of our bright future. Your clear vision and great diligence let peace be enjoyed and proceeded to touch every South Sudanese's heart in the Republic of South Sudan.

I trust your capacity and leadership because you are the kind, compassionate, and peaceful leader in South Sudan. Remember, peacemakers are children of God, and you are one of them. Your honorable character is rich with the most significant amount of compassion for the weak people and forgiveness of rebel leaders for the sake of peace. Whenever there is peace in the heart, there is love. Since you came to power, there has been no execution by firing squad in South Sudan.

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The second accomplishment under your effective leadership is the unity of 64 tribes in South Sudan. Thank you for your significant wisdom in winning the hearts of the Southern Sudanese people during the Sudanese Civil War and currently in the Republic of South Sudan. If you didn't come to power, I believe that the unity of many tribes in our homeland would never bear good fruit. Because of your authentic leadership, all tribes in South Sudan have been working in good harmony with each other as mothers and fathers, uncles and aunts, and brothers and sisters.

The third accomplishment under your wise leadership is independence. I would love to thank you for your terrific capacities and influence in separating the South Sudanese people from the Khartoum government. You are our first president in South Sudan and champion of our total independence. If you were not in power, the "New Sudan Vision" would have influenced the South Sudanese people to vote for a united Sudan and returned us to the oppressive Khartoum government, and slave trading would have repeated itself.

The final accomplishment is your incredible patience. Your humbleness, patience, and loyalty in staying firm since the SPLM/SPLA was established in 1983 brought you to be a trusted president of South Sudan. Before the referendum of South Sudan for self-determination, you gave powerful messages to the South Sudanese people about independence.

One of the good examples was the message you told the public when you returned to South Sudan from America. You declared, "If I were to be asked as a citizen to vote, I would vote for separation." This is the public teaching and influencing of a charismatic leader. Because of your powerful messages for supporting separation, the South Sudanese people followed in your footsteps and voted for separation. After the South Sudanese people won our complete freedom through voting, we became free at the very last.

My dear president, your remarkable accomplishments and achievements have been very impressive. However, some power-hunger politicians have tried to undermine them, but their selfish ideologies and interests will never succeed in South Sudan. Due to your solid record of countless achievements and great diligence, I believe that you will be our president of South Sudan at all costs.

In addition, heartless and ruthless generals under your direction have divided the South Sudanese people, who are a product of devastating, distressing, frustrating, heartbreaking, saddening, and disappointing in the Republic of South Sudan. Some of our leaders around you have been opposing peace and unity with injustices against children and women. For example, General Malual Awan Chiengkuach, currently Deputy Chief of Staff for Finance at Bilpam, kidnapped and confined my two kids in Bor, Jonglei state, without access to healthcare, no good school, and no better life.

As I was a victim of abduction in January 1987, on October 10, 2006, my two kids were abducted by their maternal uncle, General Malual Awan Chiengkuach, which violated your Republican Order, the SPLA Act, South Sudan Child Act of 2008, and our customary law.

On December 31, 2021, you issued a Republican Order N0. 27/2021, which read in part, "In exercise of the powers conferred upon me under article 101 (c) of the Transitional Constitution of

the Republic of South Sudan, 2011 (as amended), I, Salva Kiir Mayardit, President of the Republic of South Sudan, Commander-in-Chief of the SSPDF and the supreme commander of all the other regular forces, do hereby issue this republican order for the prohibition of all active officers and Non-Commissioned Officers (NCOs) in the South Sudan People's Defense Forces (SSPDF) and all other regular forces from participating in politics, the leadership of respective communities, youth or women organizations, the promotion of propaganda and hate speeches on social media platforms, 2021."

Second, the SPLA Act of 2009 states that "anybody in active military service should not be involved in community-based activities. If any member of the organized forces is interested in politics, then they must resign from active service." (Radio tamazuj in Juba, January 4, 2022, SSPDF to punish soldiers involved in politics, community organizations: <https://radiotamazuj.org/en/news/article/sspdf-to-punish-soldiers-involved-in-politics-community-organizations>).

Third, the South Sudan Child Act of 2008, section 6 states, "Whenever the Government either at national or state level, a court, a local authority, legal entity or any person determines any question with respect to the upbringing, care or welfare of a child or the administration of a child's property or any income arising from it, the best interests of the child shall be the paramount consideration."

Fourth, the South Sudan Child Act of 2008, section 10(1), states, "Every child has a right from birth to a [respected] name and to acquire a nationality. (2) Where a child has been deprived of... the elements of his or her identity, the government shall provide appropriate assistance and protection with a view to re-establishing his or her identity."

Fifth, per the Dinka customary law, "It is a crime for a family-in-law to hide children from their biological father instead of asking for wealth in exchange for children. Therefore, the family-in-law, and only if there is no proceeding in marriage, can demand the wealth to out-bond the children and hand them to their biological father."

Finally, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) is "an international human rights treaty which sets out the civil, political, economic, social, health and cultural rights of children."

My dear president, the Generals around you whom you trust have been destroyers and killers of the weak and innocent citizens. General Malual Awan has been interfering with the community activities with red hands in violation of your Executive Order and the SPLA Act of 2009. General Malual is the biological and elder son of Awan Chiengkuach Jok and a head family of the Awan family in Payath clan of Nyarweng section, although many people known him as General Malual Majok Chiengkuach. However, General Malual is the first born of Awan Chiengkuach Jok after Majok Chiengkuach Jok passed away.

As I was one of the family members, Awan Chiengkuach born Malual after his older brother Majok Chiengkuach died. Awan was a younger brother to Majok. It is a solid cultural belief and acceptable practice in the Dinka tribe that when the older brother dies, the young brother can have

children with his dead brother's wife if she still can have a baby. The acceptable practice is called *alahot* in the Dinka language—entering a house which means the young brother enters the house of his dead older brother to sleep with his widow to have children with her, and the children must be called after the dead brother.

On October 10, 2006, General Malual Awan Chiengkuach kidnapped Alakiir Ajak Deng Biar with my two kids from Nairobi, Kenya. General Malual took them to the Kakuma refugee camp and Duk County in Jonglei State. General Ajak Deng Biar traveled to Duk County and demanded his daughter through a local court with his half-brother Chief Manyok Deng Biar. Therefore, the court ruled the case in favor of General Ajak Deng Biar, and he took his daughter Alakiir Ajak Deng to school in Nairobi, Kenya.

I learned that Alakiir Ajak Deng recently married under the responsibility of her biological father, General Ajak Deng Biar. The court was fair to rule the case in favor of General Ajak Deng Biar because he was a senior SPLA leader. His brother Manyok Deng Biar is chief of Awulian, and it was clear that the case must be ruled in favor of General Ajak and Chief Manyok Deng Biar.

Second, General Malual Awan tried to claim responsibility for the daughter of General Wilson Deng Wek. General Malual Awan had repeatedly refused to attend a local court in Bortown, Jonglei State. However, General Malual used his half-brother, Chief Mabil Majok Chiengkuach, to represent him in the local court.

In response, General Wilson Deng Wek was unhappy and threatened the local court that he would shoot at the court if General Malual continued to refuse to appear at the local court. However, General Malual appeared in court, and a decision was rendered in favor of General Deng Wek. As a result, General Deng Wek took his daughter Akur Deng Wek.

Lastly, in November 2021, General Malual Awan tried to claim a daughter of the late Abuoch Atem from the Ajuong section in Twic East County and a widowed mother, Alakiir Malual Jurkuch from Anyang, Biordit, Kongor Payam in Twic East County, Jonglei State. Mr. Abuoch Atem served as a bodyguard of General Malual. General Malual took his spouse Alakiir Malual Jurkuch by force because he had been a general in the SPLA forces.

Is it fair for a general to take the wife of his bodyguard and sleep with her by force? The answer is no to other people and me, but the answer is yes for General Malual. General Malual served as a bodyguard to Dr. John Garang for many years. Still, Dr. John Garang did not take the wife of General Malual because it was not just for the general to take the wife of his bodyguard and have sexual relations with her, which was not fair.

The unfairness and shameful actions of General Malual cost the life of his bodyguard, Mr. Abuoch Atem. General Malual used to have sexual affairs with Alakiir Malual, who was legally married to Mr. Abuoch Atem. For that reason, Mr. Abuoch Atem took his own life because his boss forcibly and permanently took his wife, Alakiir Malual.

General Malual took the daughter of the late Abuoch Atem to his house in Juba to be his daughter. General Malual used the Tiger soldiers to beat the relatives who tried to take the daughter of the late Abuoch Atem. As a result, the matter was taken to the Community Trial Court, but General Malual used his ranks and half-brother paramount chief Mabil Majok Chiengkuach as a shield.

The case died at the Community Trial Court and nearly provoked violence in Juba between the Payath clan of General Malual and the Ajuong section of Mr. Abuoch Atem. However, the Ajuong community went to the Honorable Deng Dau Malek, Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs, to intervene. Lucky, Hon. Deng Dau, a Twic East Community leader, stepped in, and the daughter of the late Abuoch Atem was returned to his lawful family.

Mr. Abuoch Atem committed suicide because General Malual was unjust. However, General Malual was happy because he remained with his widowed mother, Alakiir Malual as his wife. Despite four cases with red hands, General Malual learned no lesson, and he hid my two kids, Nyadeng and Ayach, in the town of Bor without access to healthcare and a better life for them.

Honestly, the Payath clan in the Nyarweng section of Jonglei State has been imposing grave injustices and unfair habits against my two kids. The three men: General Malual and his two cousins: Mr. Majok Aleer Deng and General Majur Aleer Deng, had children with different women. They took their children after they ultimately failed to marry the mothers of their children.

For example, Majok Aleer Deng, a cousin of General Malual, had a child boy with a woman from the Kongor section of Twic East County in Jonglei State. However, Majok Aleer failed to marry the mother of his son, and he took his son Aleer Majok Aleer from the Kongor section between 2002 and 2003 when I was in Kakuma refugee camp, Kenya.

Second example, General Majur Aleer Deng, a cousin of General Malual and a younger brother of Majok Aleer Deng, had a child boy with a woman from the Equatoria region. However, General Majur took his son Ayom Majur Aleer after he failed to marry the mother of his son, and General Majur put his son to school in Kampala, Uganda.

Lastly, in the 1990s, General Malual entered a romantic relationship with the widowed mother Aluel Ajong, who had five kids with her legal husband and had two boys (Mengistu and Makuer Malual Awan). Ms. Aluel Ajong was legally married to the late Bol Ajok Deng Akol of the Palual clan of the Nyarweng section.

In 2017, General Malual decided to claim for his two boys, who were over 26 years old, in a court in Bor town of Jonglei State. On Monday, March 20, 2017, the court ruled the two boys (Mengistu and Makuer) in favor of General Malual, which was against the Dinka customary law. I heard General Malual had intimidated the court to rule the case in his favor.

The decision of the court in Jonglei State to give Mengistu and Makuer to General Malual was unfair because General Malual committed adultery. For example, General Malual had two boys with the widowed mother of five children, and she was still in a legal marriage.

In Dinka, if a man committed adultery with a woman who did not divorce her husband and had a child with the woman, the man would not take his child. Only the family of her legal husband should take the child or children. Therefore, the court ruled the two boys in favor of General Malual due to his high military rank in the SPLA leadership rather than under the Dinka customary law.

The descriptions of my case with General Malual Awan Chiengkuach are as follows:

(1) Between 1998 and 1999, Aduk Awan Chiengkuach filed a divorce claim for her husband, General Ajak Deng Biar, before a local court in the Kakuma refugee camp, Kenya. The local court confirmed the divorce of her husband.

(2) Between 2000 and 2001, I had a relationship with Aduk Awan and became pregnant.

(3) On April 14, 2002, Aduk had a baby girl, and I named my daughter Nyadeng Mamiir Chol.

(4) In November 2003, Aduk became pregnant again and rejoined me in Nairobi, Kenya. I stayed with her in the apartment I rented while waiting for my flight to America.

(5) On January 26, 2004, I went to the United States and left her in Nairobi while still pregnant.

(6) In 2004, Aduk had a child in the Kakuma refugee camp, and I named him Ayach Mamiir Chol.

(7) In 2005, Aduk Awan Chiengkuach and my two kids and Alakiir Ajak Deng were in Nairobi, Kenya, on my watch. Aleer Awan Chiengkuach, elder brother to Aduk Awan Chiengkuach, arrived in Nairobi. Aleer Awan asked me to speak with family members who lived in Africa, America, Australia, and Canada so that I would be officially permitted to be his sister's husband. Through his direction, I contacted relative members from three continents. Thankfully, the family members had accepted me as the official husband of their sister Aduk Awan Chiengkuach.

In addition, Mr. Aleer Awan told me that General Malual is the firstborn of Awan Chiengkuach Jok and the head of the Awan family. Mr. Aleer Awan sent me an email saying that after speaking with his family members in the United States, Africa, Australia, and Canada, I would contact their head of the family, General Malual. I phoned General Malual when he was studying in Nairobi, Kenya, and I often spoke with him about marrying his half-sister Aduk Awan Chiengkuach, and he accepted me.

(8) On October 10, 2006, General Malual stole my two kids from Nairobi, Kenya, and illegally transported them to Duk County, Jonglei state, without my knowledge which stopped my communications with Aduk Awan in violation of the South Sudan Child Act of 2008, section 6.

(9) In 2012, Aduk Awan, with my two kids, came to Bor town, and I spoke with her on the phone. I asked her if I could greet my kids, and she refused to let me greet my kids. I talked with General Malual in Juba about greeting my kids, but he declined.

(10) In 2013, I spoke with General Malual about paying dowries. Still, he refused to receive dowries from my uncle Atem Atem Ayach and Domenic Matiok Matiok who were ready to meet General Malual while working in Wau, Western Bhar El Ghazal State. General Malual claimed he only knew me and didn't need any involvement from my family members.

(11) In 2016, I connected my uncle Chol Ayach with General Majur Aleer Deng. My uncle Chol Ayach met General Majur at his house in Juba. General Majur agreed that he would facilitate

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marriage. Later, General Majur declined after speaking with General Malual and informing me that General Malual needed me to go to Nyarweng village for dowry payments.

(12) In 2016, after many options to marry Aduk Awan failed, I sued General Malual and Aleer Awan Chiengkuach in Community Trial Court in Juba. Still, General Malual intimidated Chief Joseph Jok Jock, and my case was trashed without transferring to the Juba high court.

(13) In 2017, I met Chiengkuach Awan Chiengkuach in Jebel, Juba, and he told me he would talk with General Malual. Later, General Malual refused, and Chiengkuach Awan informed me that General Malual “wanted you to go to Nyarweng village for dowry payments.” At the same time, I never knew where my two kids were.

(14) In August 2017, I sued General Malual and Chiengkuach Awan in the high court in Juba. Justice Achok Chan Reech accepted my case. I hired Advocate Mahgoub Osman Al Hassen to represent me in the high court. Still, Chiengkuach Awan Chiengkuach withdrew the case, and he claimed that the case should be held at General Malual’s home in Buluk per the direction of General Malual after I had returned to America. However, the issue of my kids died at General Malual’s house in Buluk, Juba.

(15) On Wednesday, April 24, 2019, I emailed Advocate Santino Wani Jada, who was working with Pan African Law Chambers. Advocate Santino Wani accepted my case, and I paid him \$ 2000 plus \$ 85 in sending fees as my lawyer. Later, the firm sent a notice of intent through the office of the General Chief of Staff to sue General Malual. However, General Malual responded to the letter that he was not the right person to be sued while he was the head of the Awan family.

General Malual’s half-brother Aleer and half-sister Aduk Awan Chiengkuach told me that General Malual is the firstborn of Awan Chiengkuach Jok, and he admitted when I used to talk with him on the phone in 2005 when he was in school in Nairobi, Kenya. In addition, the world called him General Malual Majok Chiengkuach, but his biological father is Awan Chiengkuach Jok.

Besides, Pan African Law Chambers demanded \$ 17,000 from General Malual Awan as advocate fees, which was unfair. My Advocate Santino Wani Jada requested an additional \$ 1,000 from me as advocated fees while I agreed with him to pay \$ 2,000, which he received in May 2019.

I tried to convince Advocate Santino Wani Jada that you should not charge General Malual while I paid you \$ 2,000 to work on my behalf. However, Advocate Santino Wani Jada constantly refused my advice, and I withdrew my case because of his dishonesty and greediness for money from me and General Malual Awan Chiengkuach.

Considering this dishonest practice of the Pan African Law Chambers, I am asking our government to investigate the licensing of foreign law firms in the Republic of South Sudan. Foreign law firms overcharged citizens behind our government's back, which is unfair.

General Malual never asked me for the dowry payments and refused to allow the involvement of my family members to pay the dowries. General Malual has been hurting me for many years by

confining and hiding my two kids as prisoners. General Malual prevented my two kids from having good lives, access to healthcare, and school like his children, in violation of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC). For example, General Malual’s children live in a good place and are studying well in Kenya and Uganda, while my two kids are starving in Jonglei State.

My kids were initially denied the right to healthcare and education. On January 23, 2015, South Sudan became the 195th member state of the CRC. Your excellency, the CRC protects all kids, and you have a direct role in achieving equitable education and healthcare for our kids in South Sudan. You have the right to order General Malual to bring my two kids, Nyadeng and Ayach.

My son lost his identity because of the injustices of General Malual in violation of the South Sudan Child Act of 2008, Section 10(2). My son has been deprived of circumcision by General Malual because they don’t believe in circumcision. However, circumcision is a matter of family tradition and personal hygiene. Therefore, you may order General Malual to bring my two kids.

Where around the world does a man produce children for other people? We have no customary law that allows man to produce children for others. Therefore, you may order General Malual to bring my two kids, Nyadeng and Ayach.

The Dinka customary law prevents self-loving people like General Malual Awan Chiengkuach from owning somebody’s children and avoiding sectional conflict in the Dinka society. In the Dinka customary law, a man has a right to take his children if the family members have rejected a bridegroom to make the dowry payments or a wife divorces her husband. For example, Aduk divorced her husband, General Ajak Deng Biar. Because of the Dinka customary law, General Ajak Deng has taken his daughter Alakiir Ajak Deng to school.

Kidnapping and abduction of children and women were among the leading causes of the Sudanese Civil War. The Murahalin militias used to kidnap and abduct children for slavery and women for sex slavery, kill men and raid cattle from different communities between South Sudan and Sudan. As a result, you went into war with Sudan to stop the kidnapping and abduction of children, women, and cattle raids. Your excellency, you fought against the injustices and unfair habits. Therefore, you can order General Malual and Aleer Awan Chiengkuach to bring my two kids.

The selfish and soulless interests of General Malual and Aleer in the Payath clan of Nyarweng section to own my two kids will not be entertained because it has been against peace and unity in our communities. Therefore, you can order General Malual and Aleer Awan to bring my kids.

The undeniable egotism of General Malual, General Majur, and Mr. Majok Aleer to claim their four boys (Mengistu, Makuer, Aleer, and Ayom) and the three men refused to give me my two kids, Nyadeng and Ayach are sufficient evidence of the grave injustices and unfair habits against the people of South Sudan. Therefore, I have confidence that you will order General Malual and Aleer Awan to bring my two kids.

In addition, the kidnapping and abduction of children caused the ongoing conflicts between Jonglei and Boma States in South Sudan. For example, General Malual and General Majur Aleer of the

SPLA Division 8 and 10 fought the Murle tribe of Boma State that the Murle youth groups kidnapped and abducted the children in Jonglei State.

However, they committed the same crime, and the world has not been aware of their criminal habits. Therefore, you should order General Malual and Aleer Awan to bring my two kids.

With those clarifications, General Malual decided to kill me and own my two kids without any say from my immediate family. For example, he always demanded me to go to Duk County when he was a zonal commander of Division 10, and his half-brother Mabil Majok was a paramount chief in Duk County of Jonglei State.

At the same time, General Malual rejected the involvement of my family members to pay dowries or compensation for my two kids, Nyadeng and Ayach. Second, my cousin Majak Atem was about to be killed when he passed in Duk County to go to Malakal for sports activities because many Payath clan members in the Nyarweng section knew him as my cousin when he was in Kakuma refugee camp, Kenya. However, General Kuol Manyang Juuk, governor of Jonglei State at that time, ordered security to escort my cousin Majak Atem from Poktap to Malakal and back to Juba.

Third, General Malual and Aleer Awan changed my daughter's name from Nyadeng to Yom Awan Chiengkuach in violation of the South Sudan Child Act of 2008, section 10(1). Fourth, General Malual and Aleer Awan changed my son's name from Ayach to Chiengkuach Awan Chiengkuach in violation of the South Sudan Child Act of 2008, section 10(1).

Lastly, General Malual and Aleer Awan allowed their sister Aduk Awan to have kids with different men and named them under their biological father, Awan Chiengkuach. For example, Aduk Awan Chiengkuach has four kids who follow my two kids, Nyadeng and Ayach. Their names are: Ajok, Awek, Aman, and Kuei Awan Chiengkuach.

In February 2022, family members of General Malual Awan Chiengkuach told me that my daughter Nyadeng had dental infections, but there was no good treatment. Since August 2021, my daughter Nyadeng has been suffering from teeth diseases. I am her biological and competent father who can help her, but General Malual and Aleer prevented me from helping my daughter.

My daughter Nyadeng has been suffering from dental problems because General Malual and Aleer have neglected and ignored her for over a year without access to adequate health care.


As all options failed to get my two kids from General Malual Awan Chiengkuach because he is a general of the SPLA forces who used to intimidate the chief, judge, and order Tiger soldiers to kill me, I am calling for you as a father of our nation to intervene. I have been targeted by General Malual to kill me and own my two kids, Nyadeng and Ayach. At the same time, they took their children from different mothers in South Sudan.

General Malual can kill me, and nobody will ask him because he has been a general of the SPLA forces. Therefore, as you are our father, you are the only person who can order General Malual Awan Chiengkuach in Bilpam to bring my two kids before he kills me.

Thank you so much for your consideration. I am looking forward to hearing your action.
